Your doing so will facilitate campus-wide discussion and input on relevant matters.

The *IUFMIT* will serve as the primary review body for the 08-09 and 09-10 IU model implementation.

Charge:

The IU Funding Model Implementation Team provides oversight to the implementation and review of the 08-09 Information User (IU) funding model. The group reviews and advises Vice Chancellors Doyle and Michaels on revisions to the following specific elements of the IU funding model:

IU service criteria

April-June:

- Eligible IU Services List
- Proposed IU Services and service changes
- IU Population Definitions and Weights
- IU Cost Recovery Model and IU Reserve

In addition, the team will inform broader IT advisory groups regarding the campus investment in IU services and the inherent trade-offs that exist in making IU service portfolio and service level adjustments. Any changes to the IU model will be guided by the following principles:

- The process to establish priorities for IT investment and support for the campus will be open and collaborative.
- All units benefit to some extent from the central IT infrastructure and all share in its cost.
- The model should improve predictability about IT charges to the divisions.
- The model should improve accountability and linkages between funding and service requirements.
- The model should create a rational mechanism for determining campus investment in shared IT services.

Planning Timeline for 08-09 Fiscal Year, recognizing the uncertainty of the UC and campus budgets:

**	August-	Monitor and evaluate 08-09 IU implementation; begin 09-10 IU service
	December	evaluation activities
*	December:	Propose new services, to be included in, or existing services to be retired from IU for fiscal year 09-10, to Vice Chancellors Michaels and Doyle.
o.	Late January:	With input and direction from the EVC, Information Technology Services (ITS) and Planning and Budget (P&B) vet proposed IU service changes for the next fiscal year through various stakeholder groups.
*	February:	Based on campus input, present trade-offs regarding IU service changes and overall resource constraints to the broader IT advisory structure for recommendations to keep investment in IU services consistent with campus priorities.
*	March:	Review recommended changes and outline the associated impact to the IU assessment for the following situations: Annual changes to service definitions and service levels for IU services Removal of a service from IU either through termination, or changing the service's funding mechanism to core or recharge. Adjustment to IU population definitions and weights

Following the March review, ITS and P&B carry out the necessary

operational actions to effect these and any EVC approved IU service changes

as part of the overall campus budget process.
